

Study Programme

You'll join our Centre of Excellence for Travel, Tourism and Aviation when you enrol on any of our qualifications at Level 1, Level 2 or Level 3.

If you haven't already obtained a Grade 4 GCSE in English or maths, you'll study to achieve this level of qualification alongside your course. This is a mandatory requirement and it's also essential you achieve this for many careers.

Employability

To prepare you for your future career, you'll take part in a range of 'employability' activities to equip you with knowledge and experience of careers available to you.

Employability Sessions

You'll be assigned an Employability Tutor and will take part in dedicated 'employability' sessions, which will help equip you with the skills you'll need to thrive in the workplace.

Work Experience Placement

You'll spend at least 35 hours in external workplaces across the region. You'll be helping with day-to-day tasks and shadowing staff to develop your skills and broaden your knowledge of the industry.

During your work experience you'll assist with day-to-day tasks and shadow staff to develop your skills and broaden your knowledge of the industry.


Industry Placement

You may be able to apply for an industry placement offering more than 315 hours of experience with a leading employer. These placements give you an in-depth knowledge of the industry, allow you to gain hands on experience and provide an insight into career pathways. Some of our students even go on to gain paid employment with their industry placement employer at the end of the year, so they offer a great first step into the industry. Once you complete your journey in our Centre of Excellence for Travel, Tourism and Aviation, you'll have all the skills you need to be 'work ready' and the qualifications you need to take the next steps towards an amazing career.

Courses

Level 1 | Travel, Tourism and Aviation | 16-18 / 19+

Harpurhey / Wythenshawe | One Year

Our Level 1 qualification will enable you to learn, develop and practice the skills required to get started and progress in your career in the travel and tourism sector. You'll cover topics including the UK travel and tourism industry, customer service and locational geography.

This is an ideal course for anyone looking to work in or already working in a number of travel and tourism roles including holiday representative, tour guide, tourist information centre assistant or travel agent.

Level 2 | Aviation Operations | 16-18

Harpurhey / Wythenshawe | One Year

If you want a career in aviation on the ground, this course will give you a complete introduction to airline and aviation operations.

Over the duration of your course, you'll explore a variety of roles in the sector, gaining knowledge, skills and behaviours in each area to help you decide which path to take. You'll explore all the duties of air cabin crew, from day-to-day check in services to emergency procedures, security and looking after special status passengers.

There are so many jobs in the aviation sector, so we'll look at baggage handling, boarding, arrivals and marshalling procedures. These aren't skills you can master at a desk, so you'll spend a lot of your time in a fully-equipped aeroplane cabin, galley and airport check-in area right here at The Manchester College.

Level 2 | Cabin Crew | 16-18 / 19+

Harpurhey / Wythenshawe | One Year

If you've already got your sights set on flying around the world as an air cabin crew member, this course is for you. Over the duration of your course, you'll gain the knowledge, skills and expertise you'll need for this demanding role.

As a flight attendant, your main focus will be on keeping your passengers comfortable, happy and safe. So on this course, you'll be learning all the skills you need to do just that, from emergency procedures and security policies to customer service. You'll also learn the industry 'lingo', including phonetics, international time, aircraft types and airport abbreviations.

Level 2 | Travel and Tourism | 16-18 / 19+

Harpurhey / Wythenshawe | One Year

Through our Level 2 Travel and Tourism qualification you'll develop your knowledge of the travel and tourism industry and learn about tourism destinations across the world.

You'll explore the role of a resort representative, learn about the events industry and discover the importance of customer service within the travel and tourism industry.

You'll also have the option to choose to study units that interest you such as Worldwide Travel and Tourism Destinations, Planning an Event, Event Review and Evaluation, Customer Service, Travel and Tourism Support Services, and Tourist Information Services.

As well as studying travel and tourism in depth, you'll also have the opportunity to experience the industry by carrying out at least one week's work experience which may be at a travel agent, hotel, restaurant or tourist office.

Level 3 Travel, Tourism and Aviation Operations | 16-18 / 19+

Wythenshawe | One Year

Our Level 3 course will help you to gain a thorough understanding of the aviation industry, and prepare you for employment.

You'll learn all the skills you need to succeed, including health and safety, security, customer service, aviation geography and terminology, managing conflict, e-business and more.

Few things beat first-hand experience, so you'll hear from guest speakers working in the industry and take part in simulations on an aircraft and at an airport check-in desk. You'll also get a behind-the-scenes tour of the baggage hall at an airport and explore the kinds of aircraft you could soon be working on.



Meet our Industry Partner

Claire Young | Travel Counsellors

As part of our Industry Excellence Academy for Travel, Tourism and Aviation you'll have the opportunity to gain experience working in the industry with a range of industry partners including Claire Young, a local independent business owner who offers on campus opportunities to students.

What experience do students get when they do a work placement and what can they get involved in?

Work experience allows students to use skills that they may be aware of but not necessarily use on a day-to-day basis in a classroom setting. It also allows them to gain a 'behind the scenes' look at what goes into specific job roles and also how job roles sometimes need to overlap to ensure that the customer journey is seamless.

How important is work experience in the industry?

Work experience is really important. When you see the same people every day within a classroom environment they become familiar and, whilst role play is an excellent tool for preparation, when you're in a placement you're able to use all of your communication skills in a 'real time' environment. You gain experience of how things within the industry can change quickly and more importantly how, as a service provider, you need to adapt to deal with situations that arise unexpectedly such as cancellations, schedule changes to flights, overbookings, and in-resort emergencies.

Work experience also helps students to refresh transferable skills they may have picked up in other working environments and see how those skills can transfer to the current role they are operating in, such as time management and conflict resolution.

What tips would you give to students looking to work in this industry?

Do your research

Knowing the brand and people that you will be working alongside is a great start.


Make a good first impression

If you understand the brand that you are working with then you will know what they want to see when you walk through the door on your first day. If you are working in a trendy tech outfit that operates out of an old industrial unit then dress down may be appropriate. If you know that the business you will be working with over your placement are a customer facing outfit who have a specific uniform for their employees then you may want to consider investing in some office wear.

But it's not just about your clothes. It's not unusual to feel a little overwhelmed on your first day in a placement but employers think carefully about who they allow into their businesses before they bring you on, so you wouldn't be there if they didn't think you fit the bill. Head up, smile on, and be confident (without being too big for your boots!).

Talk to people

If it's appropriate, get to know the other staff and their roles within the business, ask questions and most importantly, ask for feedback on your own performance. If you can show that you have been able to take constructive feedback, and improve on the advice given, this will go a long way with prospective employers.

Find out the options available to you at the end of your study programme.


Step 2 - Pass

Salary with experience: £32,000



When it comes to course facilities, we think you'll find it hard not to be impressed with each campuses' realistic air cabin and galley, which have been specially built for students to practise in.


You'll also have access to the same specialist check-in software used by airlines and work with industry-standard equipment like breathing apparatus and life jackets.
