


Our location

Get career ready with us

We passionately believe in helping you reach your ultimate goal, focusing on your future employability and developing the knowledge, skills and behaviours you will need to have a successful career.

Many of our programmes of study have been co-developed with industry partners. Working so closely with industry partners means you'll benefit from courses that are aligned with current industry skills and demands as well as a range of industry-level activities and lessons.

Once you complete your journey with us you will have the qualifications you need to take the next steps towards an amazing career, as well as the knowledge, skills and behaviours that will help you stand out to future employers.

Study Programmes

We offer qualifications from Level 1 to Level 3, including T Levels.

If you haven't already obtained a Grade 4 GCSE in English or maths, you'll study to work towards achieving this qualification. This is a mandatory requirement and it's also essential you achieve this for many careers.

Employability

To prepare you for your future career, you'll take part in a range of 'employability' activities to equip you with the knowledge and experience of the careers available to you.

You'll be assigned an Employability Co-ordinator and will take part in a wide range of activities which will help you develop the knowledge, skills and behaviours you'll need to thrive in the workplace.

Industry Expertise

You will get the opportunity to take part in masterclasses and lessons delivered by industry experts, visits from guest speakers within the sector and industry-standard projects, that will see you working on the kind of tasks you'd be completing once you begin your career in the performing arts industry.

Work Experience or Industry Placement

As part of your course you are required to take on external work experience. We will help you find a suitable placement. While there, you'll help with day-to-day tasks and shadow staff to develop the knowledge, skills and behaviours that are expected in the workplace and broaden your knowledge of the industry.

You may be able to apply for an industry placement offering a longer period of experience with a leading employer, depending on your course.

An industry placement gives you in-depth knowledge of the industry, allows you to gain hands-on experience and gives you an insight into career pathways.

With a placement, you're taking that all important first step onto the ladder; many of our students even go on to gain paid employment with their industry placement employer at the end of the year.

Work Related Activity

There are so many careers in the performing arts sector and we want to help you explore as many as possible during your studies.

We organise lots of work-related activities to help you discover more about the opportunities that might be open to you. You could soon be taking part in activities such as:

- Q&As with directors, choreographers, agents, alumni and other professionals
- Guest masterclasses, lectures and workshops led by experts in their field
- Live auditions and mock interviews from employers
- Mentorship from those working in the industry
- Trips to learn what it's like to work in this dynamic sector
- Live briefs working on performances, activities and briefs.



Study for a Technical Level (T Level) qualification in Media, Broadcast and Production

T Levels are a two year technical programme that provide you with a high-quality alternative to A Levels.

They have been developed in collaboration with employers, and combine theory, practical and classroom learning with a minimum 45-day industry placement. If you opt to take a T Level you will spend 20% of your time on an industry placement and 80% in the classroom.

After completing the course you can progress directly into work, on to a Higher Apprenticeship or even move on to study a university degree, as T Levels are awarded UCAS points.




T Award

Those successful in gaining a place on a T Level will be eligible for the 'T Award', a package of benefits that includes:

- → Minimum 45-day industry placement

Courses


Level 3 | T Level | Events and Venues Technician City Campus Manchester | Two Years

During the two-year programme, you will learn the core knowledge and skills that are needed for entry to a range of live sound and events production occupations through the events and venues technician specialism.

You will develop an understanding of a broad range of issues relevant to the sector, including:

- → The creative economy
- → The individual in the creative industries
- → Cultural context and vocabulary
- → Audience and consumer needs
- → Legal and regulatory requirements
- → Professional standards and conduct in the workplace
- → Equality, diversity and inclusion requirements
- → Research skills
- → Project methodology and administration
- → Continued professional development.

You will learn to expertise in a range of roles with range of professional settings: theatre, live music venues, festivals.



For those who don't meet the entry requirements and would still like to pursue a T Level, there is the option of a one-year Level 2 T Level Foundation Year. This Foundation Year will allow you to gain a qualification and move on to study a T Level the following year.

Level 2 | T Level Foundation Year | Performing and Production Arts (Technical Theatre)

City Campus Manchester | One Year

If you want to work in theatre production or music events but don't want to be on the stage, you could help make the magic happen behind the scenes instead.

You will develop knowledge and understanding through college-based workshops and then apply your learning and skills in a practical work placement.


The course will teach you how theatres and music events are supported and how the industry operates. You will learn about job opportunities and roles within the sector as well as the essential key skills in backstage and events support: sound, lighting, set design and construction, and health and safety protocols.

Jump Start To T Levels

Both our T Level and T Level Foundation Year require you to complete our Jump Start to T Levels programme as an entry requirement.

This programme is a two-week introduction to our T Level and Foundation Year programmes, where you can meet your tutors and experience what studying a T Level at The Manchester College is like.

Acting Courses

Level 1 | Music, Performing and Production Arts (Acting Pathway)

City Campus Manchester | One Year

If you're interested in performing and want to increase your knowledge and skills, this could be the course for you!

Over the year, you'll learn professional acting skills and techniques. You'll also discover more about the roles of key people within the performing arts world, such as playwrights and directors.

By the end of the course, you'll have grown in confidence and ability and you'll be ready to progress to a Level 2 qualification.

Level 2 | Performing and Production Arts (Acting)

City Campus Manchester | One Year

Do you want to develop your acting skills and learn more about your future career?

This course is designed to give you a taster of what you could expect as a professional in the performing arts sector. You'll discover what it takes to work for a theatre company and explore both on and off stage job roles.

Of course, we'll be helping you to develop your own talent. You'll learn different acting techniques and find out how to effectively research a role. As well as acting out scenes using existing scripts, you might even write your own plays to produce.

You'll be able to put your new skills to the test by performing to audiences, including in one of our two theatres!

Level 3 | Performing Arts (Acting)

City Campus Manchester | Two Years

Do you want to explore your acting skills in the heart of a vibrant, artistic city? At The Manchester College, you'll be developing your performance skills under the guidance of industry professionals.

You'll learn about current trends and practices, both within theatre and out in the world of film and television. You will soon be discovering more about contemporary theatre, site-specific theatre, movement, voice and a whole lot more.

We'll also help you to prepare for the next stage in your journey towards a professional career. You'll be honing your audition skills, learning how to network and finding out more about life as a freelance performer.

You'll also be strengthening your CV by undertaking relevant work experience. Our city is home to The Manchester International Festival, the BBC, ITV and numerous other studios and venues, and we have the connections to help you land a rewarding placement.

Plus, you'll get to perform to an audience in one of our professional theatres.



Dance Courses

Level 2 | Performing and Production Arts (Dance)

City Campus Manchester | One Year

Do you want to develop your skills in a variety of different dance styles and learn what your life could be like as a professional dancer?

During this one year course, you'll explore the world of dance and improve your techniques in a range of styles to include ballet, tap, commercial, contemporary and jazz. You'll perform set pieces and be taught how to choreograph your own routines.

Your tutors will also share their experiences of working as professional dancers. You'll learn more about life as part of a dance company and all the different on and off stage roles open to you.

You'll be putting all your new skills into practice through live performances at one of our own theatres.

Level 3 | Performing Arts (Dance)

City Campus Manchester | Two Years

Do you want to develop and master your dance skills and gain a qualification that's prized by professional companies? The Manchester College is an ISTD-approved dance centre right in the centre of this vibrant, artistic city.

You'll be taught by tutors who have enjoyed successful careers in the dance world. Some of them have travelled the globe on cruise ships, appeared on TV and worked with dance companies and they're ready to share their experiences with you.

While you'll specialise in the type of dance that you're most drawn to, you'll also develop your abilities in other styles, including classical ballet, jazz, tap, contemporary, commercial, choreography, improvisation and acro. You'll be performing set pieces, as well as choreographing your own routines and working on projects. You'll also get plenty of opportunities to perform in front of an audience in one of our professional theatres.

Our main aim is to help you to succeed in a career within the dance world, so you'll improve your audition skills and learn how to network and present yourself as a professional performer.

You'll also strengthen your CV and gain crucial experience with a work placement at a local theatre, dance company or other relevant employer.

By the time you finish your course, you'll have the skills, experience and confidence to progress onto further study at degree-level.



Musical Theatre Courses

Level 2 | Performing and Production Arts (Musical Theatre)

City Campus Manchester | One Year

If you enjoy acting, dancing and singing, you probably have your heart set on a career in musical theatre. From West End musicals to pantomimes and variety shows, this high-energy sector is great fun and incredibly rewarding. It's also very competitive, so you'll need the right training to succeed.

At The Manchester College, you'll learn from tutors who have extensive experience of both teaching and working as professional performers. You'll learn a wide variety of skills and techniques, discover what it takes to work in musical theatre and explore both on and off stage job roles.

You will study all the key aspects of musical theatre, developing your skills in singing, dance and acting, and will perform in front of a live audience in one of our professional theatres.

Level 3 | Performing Arts (Musical Theatre)

City Campus Manchester | Two Years

From Les Misérable to Hamilton, musicals are some of the most energetic, upbeat and memorable shows ever performed. On this course, you'll move one step closer to a career in musical theatre.

You'll learn from industry professionals who've performed across the globe and you'll have numerous opportunities to wow audiences yourself, including in our own professional theatres.

During the two-year course, you'll further develop your skills to become a triple threat in singing (ensemble and one to one) acting and dancing. You'll learn about current industry trends and practices, study a wide variety of musicals and develop your repertoire. You'll prepare for the next stage in your journey by perfecting your audition skills and gaining valuable work experience with a relevant employer.

By the time you complete the course, you will have developed the skills, knowledge and confidence progress to further training at degree-level.

Creative Alliance

Our Performing Arts department is committed to bringing you together with industry professionals.

We believe that the best way to shape the performing and creative artists of the future is for the industry itself to design, develop and deliver our curriculum.

Our Creative Alliance brings together an artistic collective of professionals from across the performing arts sector, who provide masterclasses, work experience, live briefs and mentorship amongst other amazing opportunities to ensure you get the most up to date and industry relevant training.

As soon as you enrol on a Performing Arts course, we'll start talking to you about the opportunities that could be open to you in the future.

Ultimately, the aim of Accelerate2Industry is to help you progress into either higher study, higher education with UCEN Manchester, or your chosen career.

The initiative runs throughout the academic year and there are three distinct phases:

Step 1 - Plan

Find out about the options available to you at the end of your study programme.

Step 2 - Pass

Your tutors will speak to you about what you're planning on doing next year and support you to secure the grades you need to move on to the next phase of your journey.

Step 3 - Progress

Your tutors will ensure that you have all of the information and support you need to re-join us in September or progress on to university, employment or an apprenticeship.

Progressors Award
