hands-on learning, preparing students for real-world challenges. Passionate about industry engagement, she is dedicated to sharing her knowledge and experience.

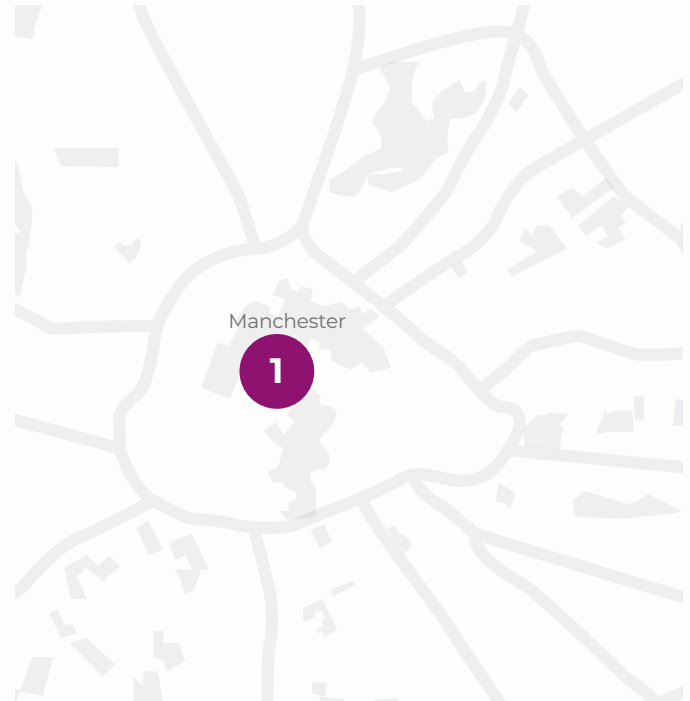
Our location

These amazing facilities mirror those used in the world of work and include:

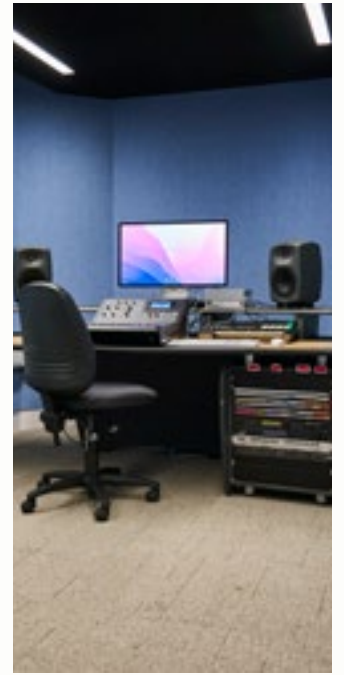
- Two state-of-the-art band teaching rooms

Get career ready with us

We passionately believe in helping you reach your ultimate goal, focusing on your future employability and developing the knowledge, skills and behaviours you will need to have a successful career.

Many of our programmes of study have been co-developed with industry partners. Working so closely with industry partners means you'll benefit from courses that are aligned with current industry skills and demands as well as a range of industry-level activities and lessons.

Once you complete your journey with us you will have the qualifications you need to take the next steps towards an amazing career, as well as the knowledge, skills and behaviours that will help you stand out to future employers.

Study Programmes

We offer qualifications from Level 1 to Level 3, including T Levels.

If you haven't already obtained a Grade 4 GCSE in English or maths, you'll study to work towards achieving this qualification. This is a mandatory requirement and it's

also essential you achieve this for many careers.

Employability

To prepare you for your future career, you'll take part in a range of 'employability' activities to equip you with the knowledge and experience of the careers available to you.

You'll be assigned an Employability Co-ordinator and will take part in a wide range of activities that will help you develop the knowledge, skills and behaviours you'll need to thrive in the workplace.

Industry Expertise

You will get the opportunity to take part in masterclasses and lessons delivered by industry experts, visits from guest speakers within the sector and industry-standard projects, that will see you working on the kind of tasks you'd be

completing once you begin your career in the music industry.

Work Experience or Industry Placement

As part of your course you are required to take on external work experience. We will help you find a suitable placement. While there, you'll help with day-to-day tasks and shadow staff to develop the knowledge, skills and behaviours that are expected in the workplace and broaden your knowledge of the industry.

You may be able to apply for an industry placement offering a longer period of experience with a leading employer, depending on your course.

An industry placement gives you in-depth knowledge of the industry, allows you to gain hands-on experience and

gives you an insight into career pathways.

With a placement, you're taking that all important first step onto the ladder; many of our students even go on to gain paid employment with their industry placement employer at the end of the year.

Work Related Activity

There are so many careers in the music sector and we want to help you explore as many as possible during your studies.

We organise lots of work-related activities to help you discover more about the opportunities that might be open to you. You could soon be taking part in activities such as:

Industry partners

When you study music at The Manchester College, you will have the opportunity to immerse yourself in the world-renowned Manchester and North West music scene.

Our Music department has long-standing links with a full ensemble of industry partners and we work in perfect harmony to open the doors that enable you to experience an exciting career in this thriving sector.

We work with a broad range of venues across the city and have an impressive track record of gigs that we have supported our students to deliver. And for all the fun, this is also an amazing opportunity to experience what working in the industry is like!

Some of the music industry partners and venues we've worked with include Ableton, The Academy, Band on the Wall, The Bridgewater Hall, Beyond the Music, Pie Radio, Reform Radio, The Warehouse Project and ThisIsNQ, Spirit Studios.

Our students regularly light up venues across the city where our musicians host and collaborate on a whole range of pro-level activities and real-life industry standard activities and performances.

But we don't just send you out on stage with no preparation. You'll get to polish your performance in our suite of rehearsal rooms and purpose-built stages and performance spaces.

That's if you're not putting your talents to use in one of our recording studios.



Our established industry partnership with Band on the Wall continues to thrive and new partnerships are constantly opening up, offering a new era of possibilities for music students at The Manchester College.

Band on the Wall is one of the most prestigious music venues in Manchester, with a long history that chronicles the cultural development of popular music in Manchester.

We have been working in collaboration with the venue for a number of years, providing students with loads of exciting opportunities. This includes showcase gigs, regular performances and open mic nights, sound engineering and technical development in a working venue, as well as marketing and promotion placements and work experience.





Courses

Level 1 | Music, Performing and Production Arts (Music Pathway)

City Campus Manchester | One Year

For anyone that's new to music technology and wants to know what it's all about, this introduction to the industry will help you get a really good grounding in professional music production.

With a hands-on focus, you'll explore all the basics of studio recording, including how to use microphones effectively and how to record and mix a track. You will create your own beats using industry-standard Digital Audio Workstation software, such as Logic, and learn the basics of DJ technology.

Level 2 | Music Performance and Production (Blended Pathway)

City Campus Manchester | One Year

This is perfect for budding musicians and producers who want to develop their skills in music performance and production. Whether you're starting from scratch or already have some skills, we'll help take you to the next level.

You'll have access to top-notch recording studios, rehearsal rooms, and Logic Pro Mac suites. You'll even have the opportunity to record yourself and bands/artists, perform live in and around Manchester, and learn how to use Logic Pro software to write and produce your own music. By the end of the course, you'll be performing your original tracks!

If you're a singer, MC, or instrumentalist looking to be in bands, write music, perform, and produce music, then this course is perfect for you. Plus, you'll gain invaluable transferable skills that are highly sought after in the music industry.

Level 2 | Music Performance and Production (Performance Pathway)

City Campus Manchester | One Year

This qualification will help you explore the music industry and develop your own skills as a musician. You will work on developing as a performer on your chosen instrument or voice, as well as learning key skills for working as part of a band.

Alongside practical work, you will also explore music theory and learn how to create your own original music using a Digital Audio Workstation (DAW).

You will take part in a range of live performances at various locations, including the iconic Manchester venue, Band on the Wall.

Level 2 | Music Performance and Production (Production Pathway)

City Campus Manchester | One Year

This Level 2 qualification has been designed for anyone looking to develop their skills, knowledge and understanding of practical and technical skills within music recording, music production, DJ skills or event production using a Digital Audio Workstation (DAW).

The course will help you to explore your interest in music production, DJ and studio technology as well as event promotion and learn more about these areas whilst building upon the core transferable skills that are invaluable within the music industry.

In your first year you will study how to perform as a band and create musical materials as well as explore different styles of music, plan a career in the industry and practical music theory.

In your second year you will select an area of the music industry that appeals to you such as performance, song writing, recording, producing, composing or teaching and complete a large scale individual project such as writing or recording an album, presenting a series of gigs as a soloist or writing music for film and TV.

You will also complete a substantial collaborative project where you will plan, market and present a major performance event as a group. You will take part in a range of live performances at various locations including the iconic Manchester venue, Band on the Wall.



Level 3 | Music Production (DJ or Live Sound Pathway)

City Campus Manchester | Two Years

In year one of this Extended Diploma, you'll study four units:

- Studio Production
- Creating Musical Material Through Production
- Music Technology for Live Events (either Live Sound Operations or DJ Technology)
- Planning a Career in the Industry.

In year two, you will work on a self-directed individual project such as writing or recording an album or composing a portfolio of music for TV, film and computer games.

You will also work on a large-scale collaborative project where, as a group, you will organise your own event, festival, recording or composing project.





Courses for Adults

Level 1 | Introduction to Music Technology and Production

City Campus Manchester | 21 Weeks (evening only)

For anyone that's new to music technology this introduction to the industry will give you a solid grounding in the area of professional music production.

With a hands-on focus, you'll explore all the basics of studio recording, including how to use microphones effectively and how to record, mix and master. You will create your own tracks using industry-standard software such as Logic and Ableton.

Level 2 | Music Technology and Production

City Campus Manchester | 23 Weeks (evening only)

Building on the skills developed at Level 1, this course introduces more advanced skills and techniques in both recording and sequencing. The music industry is also explored, including looking at how to make money out of music and promote your music to a wider audience.

Your tutors will speak to you about what you're planning on doing next year and support you to secure the grades you need to move on to the next phase of your journey.

Step 3 - Progress

Your tutors will ensure you have all of the information and support you need to re-join us in September or progress on to university, employment or an apprenticeship.

Progressors Award

Do you want to study with a higher education provider that offers something a little bit different and delivers courses that are career focused and lead you straight into employment? If so, our Progressors Award is just for you.

The award is open to all Level 3 students at The Manchester College that upon completion of their course enrol onto a higher education course at UCEN Manchester. Delivered by The Arden School of Theatre at UCEN Manchester, this programme aims to train and support creative individuals who aspire to have a career that utilises their creative skills.

Study a Bachelor's degree in Vocal Studies and Performance

You'll cover a range of topics including:

- **Contextualising Performance**
 - **Skills for the Vocalist**
 - **Solo Singing Techniques**
 - **General Musicianship.**
