

I've learnt how to communicate with people better. I work with people I don't know so I feel like in aviation, when I do go off and do that job, what I've done here in college now will really benefit me.



When it comes to course facilities, we think you'll find it hard not to be impressed with each campuses' realistic air cabin and galley, which have been specially built for students to practise in.


You'll also have access to the same specialist check-in software used by airlines and work with industry-standard equipment like breathing apparatus and life jackets.

Get career ready with us

We passionately believe in helping you reach your ultimate goal, focusing on your future employability and developing the knowledge, skills and behaviours you will need to have a successful career.

Many of our programmes of study have been co-developed with industry partners. Working so closely with industry partners means you'll benefit from courses that are aligned with current industry skills and demands as well as a range of industry-level activities and lessons.

Once you complete your journey with us you will have the qualifications you need to take the next steps towards an amazing career, as well as the knowledge, skills and behaviours that will help you stand out to future employers.

Study Programmes

We offer qualifications from Level 1 to Level 3.

If you haven't already obtained a Grade 4 GCSE in English or maths, you'll study to work towards achieving this qualification. This is a mandatory requirement and it's also essential you achieve this for many careers.

Employability

To prepare you for your future career, you'll take part in a range of 'employability' activities to equip you with the knowledge and experience of the careers available to you.

You'll be assigned an Employability Co-ordinator and will take part in dedicated 'employability' sessions which will help you develop the knowledge, skills and behaviours you'll need to thrive in the workplace.

Industry Expertise

You will get the opportunity to take part in masterclasses and lessons delivered by industry experts, visits from guest speakers within the sector and industry-standard projects, that will see you working on the kind of tasks you'd be completing once you begin your career in the travel, tourism and aviation industry.

Work Experience or Industry Placement

As part of your course you are required to take on external work experience. We will help you find a suitable placement. While there, you'll help with day-to-day tasks and shadow staff to develop your skills, learn behaviours that are expected in the workplace and broaden your knowledge of the industry.

You may be able to apply for an industry placement offering a longer period of experience with a leading employer, depending on your course.

An industry placement gives you in-depth knowledge of the industry, allows you to gain hands-on experience and gives you an insight into career pathways.

With a placement, you're taking that all important first step onto the ladder; many of our students even go on to gain paid employment with their industry placement employer at the end of the year.

Work Related Activity

There are so many careers in the travel, tourism and aviation sector and we want to help you explore as many as possible during your studies.

We organise lots of work-related activities to help you discover more about the opportunities that might be open to you. You could soon be taking part in activities such as:

- Tours of airports, heliports and hotels
- Careers talks from leading brands in the industry

Courses

Level 1 | Travel and Tourism | 16-18

Harpurhey / Wythenshawe | One Year

Our Level 1 qualification will enable you to learn, develop and practice the skills required to get started and progress in your career in the travel and tourism sector. You'll cover topics including the UK travel and tourism industry, customer service and locational geography.

This is an ideal course for anyone looking to work in or already working in a number of travel and tourism roles including holiday representative, tour guide, tourist information centre assistant or travel agent.

Level 2 | Air Cabin Crew, Travel and Tourism | 16-18

Harpurhey / Wythenshawe | One Year

If you've already got your sights set on flying around the world as an air cabin crew member, this course is for you. Over the duration of your course, you'll gain the knowledge, skills and expertise you'll need for this demanding role.

As a flight attendant, your main focus will be on keeping your passengers comfortable, happy and safe. So on this course, you'll be learning all the skills you need to do just that, from emergency procedures and security policies to customer service. You'll also learn the industry 'lingo', including phonetics, international time, aircraft types and airport abbreviations, as well as covering a range of travel, tourism and aviation topics.

Level 2 | Travel and Tourism | 16-18

Harpurhey / Wythenshawe | One Year

Through our Level 2 Travel and Tourism qualification you'll develop your knowledge of the travel and tourism industry and learn about tourism destinations across the world.

You'll explore the role of a resort representative, learn about the events industry and discover the importance of customer service within the travel and tourism industry.

You'll also study units such as careers in the industry, UK and worldwide travel and tourism destinations, planning an event, review and evaluation, knowing your airports and airlines, travel agents customer service, travel and tourism support services, and tourist information services.

As well as studying travel and tourism in depth, you'll also have the opportunity to experience the industry by carrying out at least one week's work experience which may be at a travel agent, hotel, restaurant or tourist office.

Level 3 Travel and Tourism | 16-18 / 19+

Harpurhey / Wythenshawe | One Year

Our Level 3 course will help you to gain a thorough understanding of the aviation industry, and prepare you for employment.

You'll learn all the skills you need to succeed, including health and safety, security, customer service, aviation geography and terminology, managing conflict, e-business and more. You'll also find out about the cabin crew industry, worldwide airlines, UK airports and the cruise industry.

Few things beat first-hand experience, so you'll hear from guest speakers working in the industry and take part in simulations on an aircraft and at an airport check-in desk. You'll also get a behind-the-scenes tour of the baggage hall at an airport and explore the kinds of aircraft you could soon be working on.

Your tutors will speak to you about what you're planning on doing next year and support you to secure the grades you need to move on to the next phase of your journey.

Step 3 - Progress

Your tutors will ensure that you have all of the information and support you need to re-join us in September or progress on to university, employment or an apprenticeship.

Progressors Award




Do you want to study with a higher education provider that offers something a little bit different and delivers courses that are career focussed and lead you straight into employment? If so, our Progressors Award is just for you.
