
#### Level 2 | Hair and Media Make-up Artistry (Technical) | 16-18 / 19+

## Harpurhey | One Year

This course has been developed collaboratively with employers to ensure the skills you learn are up to date and relevant to those you'll need within the industry.

You'll gain the necessary knowledge, understanding and skills to complete assessments and to plan for and provide make-up applications and hair preparation services. Through this qualification you'll study the following units:

- · Art of photographic make-up
- Health and safety
- · Create an image based on a theme
- Art of dressing hair
- Temporary hair colour
- Shaping and colouring eyebrows
- Make-up application
- Body art
- Plaiting and twisting hair.


# Harpurhey | One Year

This course has been developed collaboratively with employers to ensure the skills you learn are up to date and relevant to those you'll need within the industry.

You'll gain the necessary knowledge, understanding and skills to complete assessments and to pursue a career as an employed and/or self-employed make-up artist, providing hair and make-up services in the media, theatre, performing arts, fashion and photographic industries.

Through this qualification you'll study the following units:

- Airbrush
- · Fashion and photographic make-up
- Media make-up
- Camouflage
- Style and fit postiche
- Style and dress
- Body art.

If you're aged 16-18, our Centre of Excellence for Theatrical and Media Make-up is set up to help you do just that!

#### **Study Programme**

You'll join our Centre of Excellence for Theatrical and Media Make-up when you enrol on any of our qualifications at Level 2 or Level 3.

If you haven't already obtained a Grade 4 GCSE or the equivalent Functional Skills at Level 2 in English or maths, you'll study to achieve this level of qualification alongside your course. If you have a Grade 3, you will study a GCSE resit.

Alternatively, if you have anything lower than a Grade 3 then we will help you to develop your English and maths through Functional Skills.

This is a mandatory requirement and it's also essential that you achieve this for many careers and universities.

#### **Employability**

To prepare you for your future career, you'll take part in a range of 'employability' activities to equip you with knowledge and experience of careers available to you.



#### **Employability Sessions**

You'll be assigned an Employability Tutor and will take part in dedicated 'employability' sessions, which will help equip you with the skills you'll need to thrive in the workplace.

#### **Work Experience Placement**

If you join our Centre of Excellence you'll spend between 24 and 35 hours working in external workplaces across the region, while if you join our Industry Excellence Academy you'll complete at least 105 hours of work experience.

During your work experience you'll assist with day-to-day tasks and shadow staff to develop your skills and broaden your knowledge of the industry.

#### **Industry Placement**

You may be able to apply for an industry placement offering more than 315 hours of experience with a leading employer.


An industry placement gives you in-depth knowledge of the industry, allows you to gain hands-on experience and gives you an insight into career pathways.

With a placement, you're taking that all important first step onto the ladder; many of our students even go on to gain paid employment with their industry placement employer at the end of the year.

#### **Work-Related Activity**

You'll enjoy opportunities to learn more about the industry and build experience and connections by taking part in exciting activities such as:

- Make-up and styling support on working sets and productions for our Creative and Digital Media and Performing Arts departments
- Regional, national and even international competitions with organisations such as GM Skills, Professional Beauty North, Beauty UK, the Association of Hairdressers and Therapists, and World Skills
- Pampering and make-up events and sessions
- Make-up masterclasses and guest speakers from leading brands such as Kryolan, NYX and Morphe and make-up artists like Gillian Walsh - who has worked on ITV and BBC productions
- Trips and visits to leading brands and events like London Fashion Week.


Plus, as part of the study programme, you will perfect your skills in our training studios and work on in-house productions to help you gain confidence, along with entering competitions to showcase your skills.

#### Level 2 | Hair and Media Make-up | 16-18 / 19+

#### Harpurhey / Wythenshawe | One Year

This qualification has been specifically designed to enable you to learn both aspects of hairdressing and media make-up. Through this qualification you'll study the following units:

- Client care and communication in beauty related industries
- Make-up application
- · The art of photographic make-up

## Level 3 | Theatrical, Special Effects, Hair and Media Make-up | 16-18 / 19+


# Harpurhey / Wythenshawe | One Year

This qualification has been specifically designed to develop your practical skills to an advanced level through a variety of techniques.

During this course you'll develop your skills as a professional make-up artist working with performers to a high level of occupational ability to enable you to provide hair and make-up services in the media, theatre, performing arts, fashion and photographic industries.

Through this qualification you'll study the following units:

- Monitor and maintain health and safety practice in the salon
- Client care and communication in beauty related industries
- Apply airbrush make-up to the face
- Camouflage make-up
- Media make-up
- Fashion and photographic make-up
- Style and fit postiche
- Apply prosthetic pieces and bald caps
- Design and apply face and body art
- Style and dress hair using a variety of techniques
- Production arts planning.

Your tutors will speak to you about what you're planning on doing next year and support you to secure the grades you need to move on to the next phase of your journey.

# Step 3 - Progress

Your tutors will ensure you have all of the information and support you need to re-join us in September or progress on to university, employment or an apprenticeship.

# Progressors Award

# DEGREE LEVEL

# **Foundation Degree**

This is a two-year course, that allows you to progress onto a one-year (Top-up) degree to obtain an honours degree.

FdA Special Effects Make-up Artistry - 2 years

# **Top Up**

This is a one-year course for qualified Level 5 students to gain an honours degree.

BA (Hons) Make-up Artistry - 1 year BA (Hons) Special Effects Make-up Artistry - 1 year

# Careers





Photographic Stylist
Starting salary: £14,000
Salary with experience: £30,000

A photographic stylist, or media stylist, helps the photographer set the scene for a photograph or shoot to capture the mood, style and atmosphere that the photographer wants.

You would study briefs from photographers and carry out research for shoots, which could be for an advert in a catalogue, a magazine feature or a publicity shot for a fashion show. You'd sketch your ideas, either by hand or using a computer, to show others such as the art director and scene builders.

On a shoot, you'd be responsible for choosing props and finding out where you can hire, borrow or buy them, keeping stock of regularly-used props such as decorative items or fashion accessories and arranging the set, discussing lighting effects with the lighting technicians and making sure everything is in the right place.





Special Effects Make-up Artist Starting salary: £18,000 Salary with experience: £40,000

Special effects make-up is one of the most interesting and challenging career paths for a make-up artist. While most make-up artists work to make people more beautiful, special effects make-up artists are often trusted to do the opposite. Using your skill and creativity, you'd apply cosmetics and prosthetics to create the appearance of bruises, cuts, blood, old age, deformities, or mutations - or even turn people into creatures, monsters and aliens.

As a special effects make-up artist, you'll work with film, television and stage directors to determine how they imagine characters and scenes. Each day, actors will report to hair and make-up to have you work your magic on them.

You'll work with special make-ups and prosthetics crafted from silicone, latex, rubber and use your know-how to create moulds and casts, and safely apply prosthetics to your client.

Your skills will be highly sought after, and not just by TV, film and theatre; theme parks, cruise ships, Halloween costume companies, special effects laboratories and beauty schools often turn to special effects make-up artists.



Theatrical Make-up Artist
Starting salary: £18,000
Salary with experience: £40,000

Theatrical make-up artists apply make-up to performers to reflect the period, setting and situation of each role. They also apply make-up to enhance or alter the appearance of people appearing in productions such as movies.

You'll work with stage or motion picture officials and performers to determine the effects that are needed. You'll study production information like character descriptions, period settings and situations to determine make-up requirements.

You'll also analyse scripts, looking for events that would affect each character's appearance so you could make plans for each scene.



# **Q&A** with Gillian Walsh

When you join either our Industry Excellence Academy or Centre of Excellence for Theatrical and Media Make-up you'll have the chance to enjoy work-related opportunities that will help you learn more about the make-up industry, gain experience and build connections.

This includes masterclasses with make-up artists working in the industry and several brands including Fenty Beauty, KVD and MAC. You may be assessed by not only tutors but makeup designers such as our former student Gillian Walsh (pictured below) – who has worked on shows for the BBC such as Death in Paradise and currently holds the respected role of Makeup Designer for ITV's Coronation Street.



# Why did you become a make-up artist and how did you get started in the industry?

Hair and Make-up wasn't a career choice from school age. My dream job came at 16 when after years of being a successful amateur Irish dancer I was chosen to be in the cast of Michael Flatley's Lord of the Dance.

We wore wigs and needed to do our own hair and make-up so I was thrown right into the deep end. I was making up the lead dancers and coming up with new ways to style our wigs and found I enjoyed this so much I decided to leave the show and train to be a professional hair and make-up artist.

# What qualifications have you completed and how important have they been in your career?

I studied at the College gaining a VTCT Level 2 in Media Hair & Make-Up. I've also got qualifications in Barbering, Hairstyling, SFX and Wig Making. I have been working in the TV and film industry for 20 years and still train regularly to keep my skills fresh and up to date.

#### What has been the highlight of your career so far?

Being back at the place I was a trainee as Head of the Hair and Make-up on Coronation Street. I have also enjoyed travelling the world with my work for the BBC's Death in Paradise and ITV's Good Karma Hospital, life experiences I'll treasure forever.

## What are your top tips for learners aiming to work in make-up and media makeup in future?

My best advice is to keep going and keep positive. Make yourself hireable in a massively competitive industry by never losing your drive to learn. Contact make-up designers you see on the TV credits of your favourite show and ask their advice.

Sign up for online evening courses, work Saturdays in your local salon, or contact photographers and offer to work for free in return for portfolio pictures.

Do hair and make-up for friends and family and post shots on social media, show how adaptable you are with other skin tones and hair types.

It's not as glamorous as it sounds at times, it's hard work and long hours but nothing beats the job satisfaction and your name on that credit at the end!




