Activity 1 – Singin' in the House!

On the Musical Theatre course here at The Manchester College, we take pride in our ability to produce fantastic vocal performers. We study a range of singing techniques and methods to ensure you leave us with the best understanding and knowledge of how the voice works.

To develop your knowledge of singing techniques, have a look on YouTube at examples of the 4 vocal warm-ups below. Then record yourself doing your favourite one and tag us on Instagram @tmc_performingarts with the hashtag - #futuretmcstudent

- 1. Sirens
- 2. Lip Trills
- 3. Tongue Trills
- 4. NG sound

Once you've completed the first activity and you're fully warmed up, have a think about your favourite Musical Theatre song from any show and answer the following:

What song is the show from?

When was the show first released?

Who is the character that sings this song in the show and what is there story?

Activity 2: Actor's Lament

On the Musical Theatre course here at The Manchester College, we aim to create 'The Triple Threat,' with acting being one of those disciplines. We study a range of acting techniques, methods and practitioners to ensure you leave us with the best tools to work professionally or go onto study at a higher level.

We'd like to see you create a performance of a monologue from a published play of your choice.

Firstly, have a think about your cast ability. What types of character would you be best suited to? What is your playing age?

Next research monologues that would be suitable for you. When you find one that you are fond of, get a copy of the play and read it.

Finally learn, stage and perform the monologue using the questions below to help you with the characterisation.

- 1. What is the characters objective throughout the piece?
- 2. Who is the character talking to?
- 3. Describe the location that the character is in? (You may wish to draw this out so that you have a clear understanding of the space you are in which will help when it comes to blocking.)

Activity 3: Dancing through lockdown

In order to continue the 'triple threat' training that we offer at TMC, we have weekly dance classes in Ballet, Tap, Jazz, Commercial, Contemporary and offer additional classes in ISTD Modern for those wishing to gain extra qualifications alongside their training. It is really important that you work on your fitness levels including strength, stamina and flexibility before joining us.
