





- An infectious disease area containing a hospital bed and associated PPE resources to facilitate barrier nursing
- SimMan 3G PLUS simulation mannequins and associated software to record and assess the skills you are demonstrating
- Virtual reality software is also available to ensure you are able to learn with the most up to date technology
- A care suite with a lounge area, bedroom, kitchen and bathroom fully fitted with assistive and adaptable fixed equipment (bed/bath).

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Get career ready with us

We passionately believe in helping you reach your ultimate goal, focusing on your future employability and developing the knowledge, skills and behaviours you will need to have a successful career.

Many of our programmes of study have been co-developed with industry partners. Working so closely with industry partners means you'll benefit from courses that are aligned with current industry skills and demands as well as a range of industry-level activities and lessons.

Once you complete your journey with us you will have the qualifications you need to take the next steps towards an amazing career, as well as the knowledge, skills and behaviours that will help you stand out to future employers.

Study Programmes

We offer qualifications from Level 1 to Level 3, including T Levels.

If you haven't already obtained a Grade 4 GCSE in English or maths, you'll study to work towards achieving this qualification. This is a mandatory requirement and it's also essential you achieve this for many careers.

Employability

To prepare you for your future career, you'll take part in a range of 'employability' activities to equip you with the knowledge and experience of the careers available to you.

You'll be assigned an Employability Co-ordinator and will take part in a wide range of activities that will help you develop the knowledge, skills and behaviours you'll need to thrive in the workplace.

Industry Expertise

You will get the opportunity to take part in masterclasses and lessons delivered by industry experts, visits from guest speakers within the sector and industry-standard projects, that will see you working on the kind of tasks you'd be completing once you begin your career in the health and social care industry.

Work Experience or Industry Placement

As part of your course you are required to take on external work experience, we will help you find a suitable placement. While there, you'll help with day-to-day tasks and shadow staff to develop the knowledge, skills and behaviours that are expected in the workplace and broaden your knowledge of the industry.

You may be able to apply for an industry placement offering a longer period of experience with a leading employer, depending on your course.

An industry placement gives you in-depth knowledge of the industry, allows you to gain hands-on experience and gives you an insight into career pathways.

With a placement, you're taking that all important first step onto the ladder; many of our students even go on to gain paid employment with their industry placement employer at the end of the year.

Work Related Activity

There are so many careers in the health and social sector and we want to help you explore as many as possible during your studies.

We organise lots of work-related activities to help you discover more about the opportunities that might be open to you. You could soon be taking part in activities such as:

- Visiting residential care homes, hospitals, schools, charity shops and nurseries to learn more about day-to-day roles and responsibilities
- Taking part in insight days, including sessions focusing on nursing and midwifery led by Manchester Hospital Foundation Trust
- Hearing from guest speakers and other experts including our two specialist practitioners about the career opportunities and pathways available in health and social care.



Industry placement

You may be able to apply for an industry placement offering up to 315 hours of experience with a leading employer.

These placements give you an in-depth knowledge of the industry, allowing you to gain hands on experience and an insight into career pathways. Some of our students even go on to gain paid employment with their industry placement employer at the end of the year, so they offer a great first step into the industry.

Where could I spend my placement?







Types of Placement



Pharmacies

If you choose to take a placement in a pharmacy, you'll spend time serving and helping customers, and directing them to the pharmacists for any medical concerns. You'll learn about different medications and how pharmacists dispense and record medicines. You'll also learn about how prescriptions are handled and may be given the opportunity to attend a medical consultation with a customer.



Care homes

During a work placement in a care home, you'll help staff to deliver activities with older adults. You could also assist at meal times, spend time talking with residents to get to know them and help them feel comfortable and happy. You'd be involved in meetings with other healthcare professionals and help to make sure residents' care plans are being followed.



Hospitals

If you decide to take a placement at a hospital, you'll shadow nurses and health care assistants, and spend time observing other professionals as they work. You'll also have plenty of time to spend with patients.



Study for a Technical Level (T Level) qualification in Health and Healthcare Science

T Levels are a two year technical programme that provide you with a high-quality alternative to A Levels.

They have been developed in collaboration with employers, and combine theory, practical and classroom learning with a minimum 45-day industry placement. If you opt to take a T Level you will spend 20% of your time on an industry placement and 80% in the classroom.

After completing the course you can progress directly into work, on to a Higher Apprenticeship or even move on to study a university degree, as T Levels are awarded UCAS points.



T Award

Those successful in gaining a place on a T Level will be eligible for the 'T Award', a package of benefits that includes:

- → Access to an industry-standard laptop* (as appropriate)
- → Opportunities to take part in exciting college-wide competitions
- → Minimum 20% delivery by industry experts
- → Minimum 45-day industry placement
- → Free branded work wear

- → Bursary incentive if progressing to UCEN Manchester
- → Guaranteed progression to a higher education course at UCEN Manchester
- → Use of industry based software
- → And much more.

Courses

Level 3 | T Level | Health (Assisting Adult Nursing) Openshaw | Two Years

If you want to follow a career in adult nursing then this is the T Level for you!

You'll begin by learning all of the essential knowledge and skills you'll need to work in the health and science sector, including how the industry works, core concepts and key regulations, such as managing information, health and safety, and good scientific/clinical practice.

Once you've gained the core knowledge you need you'll specialise in the care of adults. You'll learn all about assisting with clinical tasks and the treatment of service users, providing care and support to service users before, during and after clinical or therapeutic procedures, and taking a physiological reading of service users and recording their data.



For those who don't meet the entry requirements and would still like to pursue a T Level, there is the option of a one-year Level 2 T Level Foundation Year.

This Foundation Year will allow you to gain a qualification and move on to study one of our T Levels the following year.

Level 2 | T Level Foundation Year | Health and Social Care Openshaw | One Year

This course has been designed to develop your understanding and knowledge of the health and social care sector, so that you can progress onto our T Level course in Health (Assisting Adult Nursing).

As with the T Level itself, the focus is on helping you to gain practical skills that will prove invaluable when you get out into the workplace. And you'll be putting those skills into practice almost straight away, as you'll be benefiting from an industry placement lasting at least 105 hours.

Throughout the course, you'll also have the chance to hear from professionals, like midwives and nurses. They'll talk to you about their own career paths, the sorts of skills and behaviours you'll need to succeed, and what opportunities are open to you. You'll learn all about human lifespan development, health and social care values, infection control and much more ahead of moving on to study a T Level.

As well as working towards a Level 2 qualification in health and Science, you'll also work to gain a qualification in Emergency First Aid when you progress onto a T Level.

Jump Start To T Levels

Both our T Level and T Level Foundation Year require you to complete our Jump Start to T Levels programme as an entry requirement.

This programme is a two-week introduction to our T Level and T Level Foundation Year programmes, where you can meet your tutors and experience what studying a T Level at The Manchester College is like.

Courses

We offer a range of courses for all abilities and ages. Whatever your starting point, we can help you to gain the knowledge, skills, experience and confidence you need to progress to a range of career paths or onto further study.

Level 1 | Health and Social Care | 16-18 / 19+

Openshaw (16-18) / Harpurhey or Wythenshawe (19+) | One Year

There are so many different career paths in the health and social care sector. This Level 1 course will introduce you to the key roles and services to help you decide what path to take.

You'll gain a greater understanding of the sector as a whole and develop a range of specialist skills. By the end of the course, you'll be in a great place to progress to the next level.

Level 2 | Health and Social Care | 16-18 / 19+

Openshaw (16-18) / Harpurhey (19+) | One Year

If you have a keen interest in health and social care and are eager to expand your knowledge and develop the skills that employers are looking for then our Level 2 course is for you. You'll take a more focused look at the industry, starting with examining the core values of health and social care.

You'll also explore the key aspects of effective communication and the importance of equality and diversity. You'll learn all about how people change and develop as they grow from a baby right through to an older adult, and discuss how people need different care and support depending on the stage of life they're at. You'll also spend time learning about health and wellbeing, and finding out how you can help people to lead healthier lives.

Level 3 | Health and Social Care | 16-18 / 19+

Openshaw (16-18) / Harpurhey (19+) | Two Years

Are you ready to take an in-depth look at the health and social care sector and gain all the skills and knowledge you'll need to progress to higher education or out into the workplace? Then this is the course for you.

You'll learn more about how the body functions and changes over time, and you'll study anatomy and physiology. You'll also develop your understanding of how to meet individual care and support needs, and we'll be discussing how you can help people to lead healthier lives.

Plus, you'll spend more time learning about what it's like working in the sector, with a focus on your chosen career path. You'll get to experience this for real through at least 100 hours of work experience. Whether you're planning to progress to a nursing degree, are aiming for a career in management, or want to work within a nursing home or other care setting, this course can help you get there.





Courses for adults

Level 2 and 3 | Preparing to Work in Adult Social Care | 19+

Harpurhey or Wythenshawe (Level 3 at Harpurhey only) | One Year

This course provides an ideal taster for learners who may be new to the health and social care sector or new to the world of work. It is accessible to adult learners of all ages who may want to understand more about working in health and social care.

You'll be introduced to some basic concepts of caring and preparation for employment in the sector. You'll gain knowledge and skills in communication, equality, diversity and inclusion, the role of the social care worker, handling information, health and safety, safeguarding, duty of care and person-centred approaches.

Level 2 | Counselling Concepts | 19+

City Campus Manchester / Shena Simon | 10 weeks

Our Level 2 qualification will introduce you to the use of counselling skills in everyday life and work, and some of the approaches that underpin the use of these skills. You will learn about the knowledge and skills needed to use counselling skills and engage in a helping interaction appropriately. It is a useful qualification for anyone who would like to develop their use of counselling skills in either a work or personal capacity.

Level 3 | Counselling Skills | 19+

City Campus Manchester / Shena Simon / Wythenshawe | One Year

Our Level 3 qualification is designed for those seeking progression to become a qualified professional counsellor or for individuals who wish to acquire greater counselling skills for use in other work areas. For example, nurses, social workers, teachers and health professionals.

Choose between one year degree-level courses to build your skills and confidence, and three year degrees.


