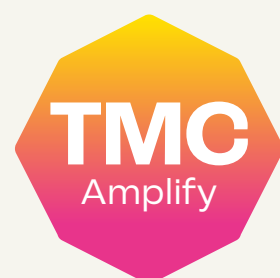




Student Voice

Student Governor

- Number of posts: one
- Age group: over 18-years-old
- Commitment: attend termly UCEN Manchester Divisional Board meetings and termly LTE Group Board meetings, plus an annual strategy event
- How to apply: email the Governance Team on Governance@ltegroup.co.uk.

The successful applicant would join the UCEN Manchester and LTE Group Boards and participate in the business of the Board.

As part of this role, you will be required to attend Board meetings at least once a term.

Student Co-opted member role (The Manchester College)

- Number of posts: one
- Age group: 16 to 18 and adults (19+)
- Commitment: attend termly The Manchester College Board meetings
- How to apply: email the Governance Team on Governance@ltegroup.co.uk.

The Student Co-opted member role will sit on The Manchester College's Board. In addition to reviewing the educational character, mission, values and strategic priorities of our College, the Board also monitors all aspects of our College's provision, including its financial performance and student outcomes.



Campus Leadership Team

- Number of posts: various
- Age group: 16 to 18 and adults (19+)
- Commitment: attend termly meetings
- How to apply: complete an application form.

Each campus has a Student Leadership Team, which represents students at the respective campus on matters that impact the entire student body. The team is expected to share their feedback and ideas with their campus's management team to make changes that will benefit current and future students at the campus.

Student Reps

- Number of posts: various
- Age group: 16 to 18 and adults (19+)
- Commitment: attend at least four Student Rep meetings
- How to apply: speak to your course Tutor.

Each course or level elects a Student Rep. The role is there to help improve our College's courses and help students overcome any challenges they face in relation to their studies. Student Reps meet regularly with tutors as part of our staff and student committees, and they share feedback and offer suggestions that they believe will benefit all students on their course.

All roles outlined above will be advertised from enrolment and if an application form is required there will be digital and paper versions available.

For the Student Governor role students shortlisted following the interview stage will be required to run an election campaign during which all students will be able to vote for their preferred candidate.

Desirable skills/attributes:

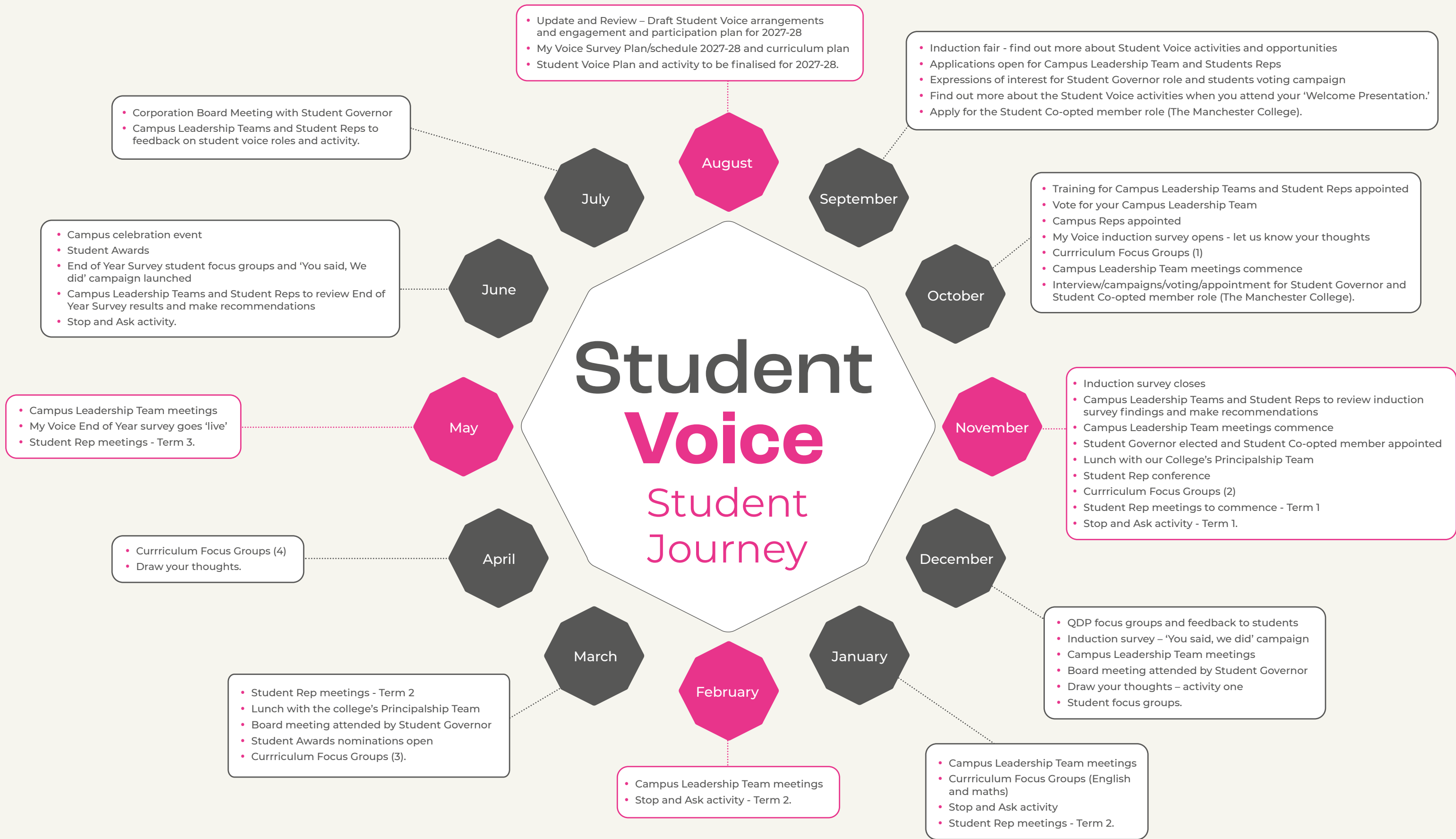
- Flexible
